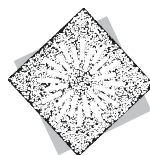

What is Spiral Dynamics?

An advanced extension and elaboration of the biopsychosocial systems concept originated by the late Dr. Clare Graves, Spiral Dynamics® explains deep forces in human nature which shape our values, and lays out both a pattern and trajectory for change. Dynamic Spiral forces attract and repel individuals, form the webs and meshes that connect people within groups, communities and organizations, and forge the rise and fall of nations and cultures.

By exploring the core intelligences and deep values that flow beneath what we believe and do, Spiral Dynamics offers a profoundly incisive, dynamic perspective on complex matters, such as:

- How people think *about* things (as opposed to what they think)
- Why people make decisions in different ways
- Why people respond to different motivators
- Why and how values arise and spread
- The nature of change

On day two of Beck's presentation, a panel of local experts will lead an in-depth discussion of practical applications of Spiral Dynamics theory, including therapeutic contexts, families and communities, spiritual practice and theology, organizational change and global peace efforts.

Dr. Don Beck has developed, implemented and taught Spiral Dynamics for more than 30 years. As co-founder of the National Values Center and CEO of the Spiral Dynamics Group, Inc., Beck employs the model to affect large-scale systems change in and among the world's various sectors and societies, including South Africa's peaceful transition from apartheid to democracy and the Middle East's current struggle to negotiate peaceful solutions to long-standing conflicts. He is the co-author of *The Crucible: Forging South Africa's Future* and *Spiral Dynamics: Mastering Values, Leadership & Change*. Beck was team psychologist for the South African Springboks and associated with NFL and MLB teams, as well as the U.S. Olympic Committee for Men's Track and Field.
