Process Mentoring[®] utilizes the Process Communication Model[®], a scientifically designed personality assessment tool enabling more effective communication between all persons in one's life.

Each participant will receive a unique personality profile, workbook and personal action plan.

Twelve full-paid scholarships are available; however, for those who do not meet the criteria for the grant scholarship, the registration fee is \$50.
