Prairie View Offers Process Parenting Seminar, Scholarships Available

Newton, Kan. – Prairie View will host a one-day seminar for parents, grandparents and caregivers on Tuesday, March 16, in the Prairie View Auditorium, 1901 E. First Street, Newton, on March 16 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

This seminar will examine how parents and youth resolve conflict and teach new skills that are motivating and healthy for both parties.

“The purpose is to learn to better assess the needs of both ourselves and our children, connect better with our children and resolve our conflicts with our children in healthy ways,” said Ryan Kopper, adventure facilitator.

Each participant, who can be anyone with a child under his or her care, will receive a personality profile, workbook and personal action plan.

The seminar is covered by a grant, which allows some seats to be filled for free by those who qualify.

Only 12 scholarships are available. Those interested in attending are encouraged to reserve their place soon. Those who do not meet the criteria for the grant scholarship will be required to pay \$99.
